 - a. The questions will be made available before the panel
- 3. Stories and questions from students may be used for the basis for discussion
- 4. Each session will be recorded for creating engagement after the event.
 - a. This means that it will be a live event with student participation.
 - b. Student questions will be collected in the registration process and compiled

> UNIverse Beyond Zoom Proposal Emergency Central Committee Meeting #3 – Monday 19th July 2020

1. Introduction

UMSU will be hosting an online virtual Carnival Day during this Winterfest instead of a physical one due to current restrictions in Victoria and Covid-19. UMSU has invited UMSU International and all the other departments to participate in this online Winterfest using an online service called HopIn. HopIn is a virtual venue with multiple interactive areas that are optimized for connecting and engaging. Attendees can move in and out of rooms just like an in-person event and UMSU hopes it can somewhat emulate the feeling of an in-person Carnival Day. 2. Objective

- Introduce new students to UMSU International and the services we provide
- Provide a venue for these new students to learn about how the online learning experience was at the university during the first semester of 2020 and how they can prepare themselves for the following semester.
- Give both general and course-specific advice through peers who have experience in the subject

3. Events

This event will have two parts to it running concurrently. The first part will be on HopIn while the second part will be on Zoom.

• HopIn

Like previously mentioned HopIn is an online service made to emulate an actual event. We will be part of the Expo section of HopIn, alongside the other UMSU departments. In this section when users enter our virtual booth, they will be greeted with a video of our choosing. Following the video, they will see a maximum of 4 people live-streaming themselves. These people will be current office bearers who would like to be and comfortable with being featured and online on the platform. The idea is to have podcast type sessions to take place where 3 - 4 office bearers talk about their experience in the previous semester. These sessions will also explain what UMSU International is about and will answer questions from the chat function HopIn provides within our booth. Since Carnival day is from 12 PM - 4 PM, we will have 4 sessions and with a break in between. Timing for these sessions are as follows:

12 PM - 1 PM	Session 1
1 PM - 2 PM	Session 2
2 PM - 2:30 PM	Break
2:30 PM - 3:15 PM	Session 3
3:15 PM - 4 PM	Session 4



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These sessions will have a main host who will guide the session with questions, scenarios, and various other antics. Each session will have different office bearers to not keep the conversation stale and to let office bearers take breaks. A Lucky will draw will also be present for people to enter if they sign themselves up for our newsletter. The button/link for this will be present throughout the 4 hours in our booth. We plan to give out 250 Coles Group and Myer Group gift cards to those still in Australia and possibly Netflix subscriptions to those outside Australia. The winnings will only be bought after the event itself to buy the exact amount of gift cards needed to not buy any extra. Any suggestions for alternatives for people outside Australia by the committee would be greatly appreciated.

• Zoom

Alongside The button to the lucky Draw, a Zoom link will be available for students to click on. This Zoom link will be hosting more personal, course-specific panels and discussion hosted by ISAs. These will be in the breakout room. When students enter the Zoom Call, they will be guided by a CnS officer into the specified breakout zoom already made and filled. This will give students a chance to ask about more specific questions about their course and what to expect/ prepare for. We would want each ISA to be in a breakout room not more than 2 hours or throughout the whole 4-hour period with breaks in between. The Officer would have the schedule for each ISA in a google sheet so they can let the student know if that ISA is live or not.

4. Budget

As previously mentioned, we plan to give out 250 lucky draw prizes in substitute for the goodie bags this Winterfest.
